- ✓ Conduct a search for a topic


- A. Type the search terms in the red box. Users have the option to use terms & connectors (Booleans like “and”, “or”, “w/p” etc.) or the natural language processing (type problem statement or just keywords). For later, just simply
- B. Choose the jurisdiction by changing the flag based on your preference.

Note: You can still search results from different jurisdiction. The flag you have chosen will be shown in your first result page.

- C. Click on the search everything dropdown to narrow down your search (by content type, by topic etc.)

Note: the dropdown option will may differ based on jurisdiction chosen

- D. Press “Enter” or Click on Search





- General Search – Red Box – Filtration tool

- User can change between results from different content type (cases, legislation or secondary materials).
- Enter more keywords to search across the result list.
- User can narrow down cases based on courts on which the result originate from.

Note: user can use “select multiple” to choose more than one court. E.g. narrowing down case only from appellate courts (Court of Appeal & Federal Court)

- In the Timeline filter, users can filter the period of cases that they want to see by clicking on the date and year.
- In publications filters, users can choose to only view results from specific publication by clicking on the title.





- Case Search – by case name or citation

E.g. to locate the case “Tan Ying Hong v Tan Sian San & Ors [2010] 2 MLJ 1”

- Type in the case name or citation, choose the dropdown of the relevant case and press enter.
- Choose any of the citation hyperlink to view the full judgment.
- User have options to turn off highlight.
- For recommendation of cases that discuss similar principles, user can select from the “Recommended Case” pod in the right hand side.
- When PDF “Download Document” is available user can click on the download link on the right-hand side.
- if the court ready version is not available, User can still download the document via the normal download method.
- Select Formatting Options







Held, allowing the appeal with costs here and below: (1) per Zaki Azmi, Chief Justice, Malaysia and Arifin Zakaria CJ (Malaya): Section 340(1) of the NLC confers an immediate indefeasible title of interest in land upon registration, subject to the exceptions set out in s 340(2) and (3). According to the Adoma Properties case, Adoma Properties, the appellant, had acquired its title to the land through or under a forged instrument and it therefore came under the category of s 340(3). The court then held that such a title was insulated from impairment by the proviso in s 340(3) of the NLC. The question which arose was whether the proviso immediately after s 340(3) applied to other provisions of s 340, in particular, to s 340(2)(b). This could only be deduced from the words used. Since the substance of the proviso is a protection against a charge, it could not apply to another subsection and not a proviso provided its application to the provision and existing proviso of the proviso does not alter the effect of the proviso. It is therefore clear that the proviso in s 340(3) of the NLC is intended to operate alone and not to the earlier subsection. This is supported by the use of the words 'proviso' in this subsection (a) in the proviso. Therefore its application

- **Browse Source – MY & International Content**

CaseBase Signals

CaseAnalysis uses signals to indicate what kind of treatment a case has received and whether it can be relied on as good law. The table below explains the meaning of these signals.

Note:

Not every case has a CaseAnalysis Signal.

Signal	Summary	Explanation
	Negative treatment	Warning – Negative treatment indicated. A negative (red) signal is given to decisions which have been subsequently reversed, disapproved or overruled.
	Cautionary treatment	Caution – Questioning or distinguishing treatment indicated. This indicates that the decision has had some doubt cast on it.
	Positive treatment	Positive treatment indicated. A positive (green) signal is given to decisions which have been subsequently affirmed, applied, etc.
	Neutral treatment	Neutral or citing treatment indicated. The decision has received neutral or ambivalent treatment: considered, explained, etc.
	Citation information	This indicates that no treatment has been given--only citation information is available.

- Terms & Connectors – guide

Lexis Advance® Malaysia uses the following order of terms & connectors

Terms & Connectors	Examples/Explanations
AND	<p>Use the <u>and</u> connector to find documents containing two specific words or phrases, regardless of the order in which they appear or their proximity to each other.</p> <p>For eg. ‘amendment AND leave’</p>
OR	<p>Use the <u>or</u> connector to find all documents that contain either or both words or phrases linked by the or connector. The location of the word or words within the document does not matter.</p> <p>For eg. ‘judgement OR order’</p>
w/p	<p>Use the w/p (within paragraph) connector to find documents where the search terms appear within the same paragraph. The order in which the words appear within the document does not matter.</p> <p>For eg. ‘service w/p out of jurisdiction’</p>
w/s	<p>Use the /s (within sentence) connector to find documents where the search terms appear within the same sentence.</p> <p>For eg. ‘judicial w/s review’</p>

w/n	<p>Use the w/n connector to find documents in which a given word appears within "n" words of another given word in the same document section. The value of "n" can be any number up to 255.</p> <p>For eg. 'affidavit w/n defective'</p>
"..."	<p>The placement of search terms in quotation marks is used to retrieve documents containing the exact phrase enclosed in the quotation marks. The search would not, however, retrieve documents that use the separate terms in a different order.</p> <p>For eg. "'assessment of damages" '</p>
!	<p>Use the exclamation (!) character at the end of a root word to find the root word and all the words that can be made by adding letters to the end of it, including plurals.</p> <p>For eg. 'damage!'</p>
